Baby People’s Educational work covers everything from one off workshops to full academic year placements, working from Primary school age to Post-16. Our focus is on working with young people that struggle to engage in mainstream education. Group classes or one to one sessions can take place at our recording studios or offsite, depending on the needs of the student. Most courses can include qualifications ranging from Level 1 to Level 3 units. We run a number of different educational sessions in music production, creative writing, graffiti art, break dance and more.

During summer we also run a Summer Arts course and weekly we hold free studio sessions at the Baby People Community Studios for 13-19 year olds at our four Derbyshire based satellite studios and our Wolverhampton studio. Baby People have also developed a well-established track record for programming and running events and festivals in the region, that students can get involved in.
